

# **REPORT OF REGIONAL FUNCTION OF 27<sup>TH</sup> CONVOCATION**

**16 APRIL 2014**

## **REGIONAL CENTRE, KORAPUT (ODISHA)**

The Regional Function of the 27<sup>th</sup> Convocation of Indira Gandhi National Open University was organized in the premises of Sanskruti Bhawan, near Collectorate, Koraput on 16.04.2014.

Prof. B.C. Tripathy, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Ravenshaw University, Cuttack graced the function as the Guest of Honour. The Convocation started at 4.20pm immediately after the main function at the Headquarters was concluded.

It was formally inaugurated by Prof. Tripathy by lighting of the lamp. First of all Mr. Dharmarao Gonipati, ARD welcomed the Guest of Honour and the Regional Director onto the dais with the presentation of bouquets. Prof. Tripathy was joined by the



Regional Director and the Assistant Regional Directors in this. Then the Regional Director Dr Abhilash Nayak presented the report of the Regional Centre before the audience. In course of his presentation, he highlighted the initiatives, challenges and achievements of the Regional Centre since its inception with special focus on the activities carried out in the last academic year (Soft copy of the report is attached for your reference and record). His presentation of the report was followed by the delivery of the Convocation Address(Copy attached)

by the Guest of Honour, Prof. B.C. Tripathy, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Ravenshaw University, Cuttack. In his Convocation Address, Prof. Tripathy focussed on the significance of the Convocation, the relevance of the education in moulding human life, the role played by IGNOU in general and the IGNOU Regional Centre, Koraput in particular in reaching out to the disadvantaged sections of people inhabiting this region. At the end of his Convocation Address, he stressed upon the need for the Universities to produce thinking liberal minds which would be dedicated to fight narrow ideas and strive to bring about qualitative changes. He also focussed on the need for students to be the harbingers of change and build an India greater than what it has been.

Then Dr. Latika Mishra, ARD presented the awardees to the Guest of Honour to award degrees to them. A total number of 1590 learners of various programmes under different schools received their degrees in person and in absentia. This year, the Regional Centre had conducted some essay writing and debate competitions at Junior and Senior levels among the college students and debate competitions among the students of



IGNOU. Sh. C.A. Narasimha, SO presented the names of the winners to the Guest of Honour who gave away the prizes to all the winners. Sh. Madhaba Kumar Bisoyi, ARD proposed Vote of Thanks to the Guest of Honour and to all the delegates to the District Administration, to the Regional Centre Staff and the

functionaries of the Learners Support Centres for making the Convocation a success.

The Convocation ended with the singing of National Anthem.

## IGNOU REGIONAL CENTRE, KORAPUT, ODISHA

### REPORT OF THE COORDINATORS'/PICS' MEET

**2<sup>ND</sup> AUGUST 2014**

The sixth Coordinators/PIC's Meet of Regional Centre, Koraput was successfully organized in the Conference Hall of Skill Development Centre, Koraput on 2<sup>nd</sup> August, 2014. Coordinators, Assistant Coordinators, PICs and APICs of Study Centres spread over twelve districts of Odisha and Chhattisgarh attended the Meet and made it a success.



The Meet was inaugurated by the Chief Guest Mr. Ekadasi Jena, Additional District Magistrate, Koraput by the lighting of the lamp. He was accompanied by the Regional Director, Dr. Suresh Kumar Tripathy, Dr P.C.Mohapatra, Director, COATS and Prof. Jagabandhu Samal, Faculty of COATS, Koraput.

Regional Director welcomed the Chief Guest and the participants and highlighted in brief the objectives of the meeting. During the presentation he also draw attention of



every body towards the scope of IGNOU in a tribal and backward region like Koraput. The Welcome Address of the Regional Director was followed by the Address of the Director, COATS, Koraput. In his address, he briefly spoke about the background of the IGNOU Regional Centre. While appreciating the efforts of the Regional Centre in increasing Students' Enrolment and Student Support Services to reach out to all the remote areas in this region, he stressed upon



the consolidation and strengthening of the existing Study Centres of the region. Prof. Jagabandhu Samal in his address encouraged the Coordinators of the Study Centres for better student support services. He highlighted the scenario of higher education in tribal areas and the suitability and flexibility of the Distance education system to address the need of the learners of this region.

The Chief Guest Mr. Ekadasi Jena in his address highlighted the importance of higher education in the life of the disadvantaged sections of this region. He also focussed on the specific role of the IGNOU Regional centre in this region to nurture the talents of this region.



In the next session on academic issues, Dr. Suresh Kumar Tripathy, Regional Director

Made a presentation on Distance Education: An Overview. In his presentation he highlighted the main features of distance education such as :



- Relaxed Entry qualifications
- Learning at ones own pace
- Two Way communication
- Self Instructional Study Materials
- Use of Electronic media
- Extended Student support services
- Advanced method of evaluation
- Degree by cumulative credits

He also discussed the importance of the use of various technologies in distance education such as Print, Radio, Audio CDs, Video CDs, CD ROMs, Radio broadcast, Teleconferencing, Computer Based Online Learning, Edusat Supported Learning and Tele Teaching. During his presentation he also emphasized on the nature of distance learners and the role of IGNOU.

Thereafter all the Coordinators made a brief presentation about their study Centre with reference to achievements, enrolment scenarios, student support services and administrative as well as financial issues pertaining to the functioning of the study centres.



Some of the important issues and suggestions highlighted by the Coordinators during the discussion are as follows:

**Issues and Concerns of coordinators:**

- Lack of Self Instructional Materials as per the requirements
- Lack of furniture and computers in some of the special study centres
- Opening of different state universities in interior pockets and offering programmes through off campus study hampers the enrolment of Study Centres.
- Some of the assignments are not uploaded in the website, and not supplied to the study centres, particularly for Odia materials.
- Programme guides are not supplied to the study centres according to the numbers of students enrolled in different programmes
- Some of the Observers create problem during the conduct of examinations
- Lack of space to keep the study materials at the SC
- Some of the students are not able to know the status of their admission due to lack of communication facilities and internet connectivity at the remote SCs.
- Reimbursement of fees of SC/ST students

**Suggestions offered by the coordinators:**

- Printing and supply of Information Booklet for the learners containing the details schedule of activities of IGNOU
- Supply of Banners and Posters and hoardings by the Regional Centres for Promotional Activities
- Self-learning materials and assignments in each medium should be provided to the learners and Study Centres in time, so that the students are able to prepare assignments and submit them in time.
- Orientation of SC functionaries / newly appointed academic counselors at Study centre levels
- Sharing of good practices of study centres in the Coordinator's meet
- To provide necessary facilities to organize promotional meetings at GP level to create awareness among the general public
- Repairing of the Computers, Printers and other accessories supplied to the Study Centres.

- Issuing I Card to the Coordinators of Study Centres located in of Maoist infested areas.
- Orientation to the students and SC functionaries regarding the use of IGNOU website for various purposes.

The third session on Admission and Promotional Activities was taken by Dr. Latika Mishra, Asst. Regional Director. During the discussion she highlighted the status of different Study Centres based on the scenario of admission and presented the comparative figure of the enrolment for last three cycles (Jan, 2013 to Jan, 2014) of all the study centres. She also discussed the promotional activities conducted by the Regional Centre for the enhancement of enrolment for July, 2014 cycle. During the presentation she also highlighted some of the promotional activities planned at Regional Centre level for January, 2015 and asked the Coordinators to cooperate the Regional Centres in the organisations of those activities at different levels (G.P level to District level).



The next session on “Functional Issues related to Student Support Services” was taken up by Mr. Dharma Rao Gonipati, Asst. Regional Director.



He highlighted some of the specific issues related to distribution of Self Instruction Materials, induction meetings, promotional activities, submission of assignments, conduct of examinations, submission of projects and guidelines for projects, conduct

of counselling classes, submission of bills related to different activities of Regular Study Centres, Special Study Centres and Programme Study Centres etc.

The last session was taken up by Dr. Suresh Kumar Tripathy, Regional Director regarding the Road Map for Future. In this session he highlighted some of the specific activities for the promotion of IGNOU as well as for the better student support services at both Regional Centre and Study Centre level.



At the end of the Meet, all the participants were asked to submit their Feedback Form and provide their inputs on the various aspects of the Coordinators' Meet. Most of them found all the areas either to be excellent or very good and a few of them found them good and only a negligible number of participants found them to be satisfactory or manageable which is indicative of the success of the Meet.



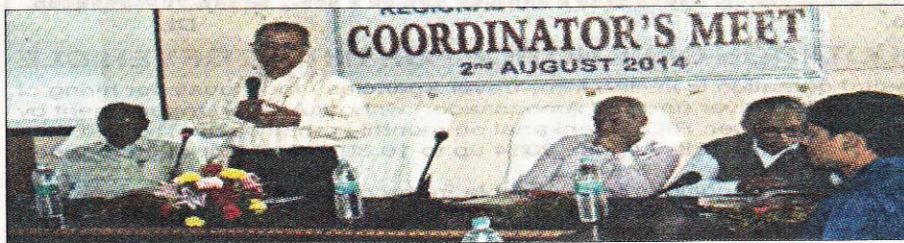

# IGNOU committed to reach the unreached

INDIRA Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU), Koraput Regional Centre has prepared a roadmap to ensure all round development of the learners while reaching the unreached areas by opening up more study centres in the districts under the jurisdiction of the regional office, said its Director Suresh Kumar Tripathy at the 29th Foundation Day celebration of IGNOU here today.

Tripathy further informed that the Regional Centre has plans to increase the enrolment of learners in different courses over the years and expressed confidence that best quality education will be provided to the learners. Explaining his mission to reach the unreached in the remote areas, the Regional Director told that steps are on to do the best for the learners.

Briefing the media persons, IGNOU, Tripathy said the district administration has given 1 acre land near B.Ed College in the town where the construction of the office building would begin soon. IGNOU regional centre has become an important hub of education for the region he added stating further that many technical courses are not yet been implemented in this region by the university for the lack of resources. However, with the sup-



port of journalists, academicians many more courses could see the light of the day in the next few years to come. Distance Education would be handicapped without the support of media, he said.

Speaking on the occasion, IGNOU, Koraput Regional Centre Assistant Director Dharma Rao Gonipati explained media persons about Bachelors Preparatory Programme (BPP) of the IGNOU and its importance. Gonipati also informed the scribes about the number of active study centres functioning under the IGNOU Koraput Regional Office. Out of 37 study centres, 31 centres are functioning at present, he added.

Among others, Semiliguda and Sunabeda based IGNOU study centre coordinators and the employees of the regional centre were present.
